










Employment Growth Over The Past Decade Has Been A Struggle For Anchorage




The Strange Dynamics of Alaska's Crazy Labor Market



Percentage Change in Working Age (18-64) population 2013-2021




Anchorage Hotel Room Sales Recovered Last Year





Car Rentals In Anchorage Reached New Levels




Number Of Home Sales In Anchorage Slowing Down Some? (But still higher than 2018-2020, at least thru 3rd quarter)


Home Building Activity-Fewest Since 1989 in 2021





When Anchorage's Homes Were Built




Vacancy Rates For Anchorage




Alaska Oil Industry Employment Continues To Struggle




Nice Recovery In Oil Prices




Mining Employment Keeps Inching Up




Anchorage Uniformed Military Numbers Remain Relatively Stable






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Anchorage's Population Fell Again In 2022-600 Fewer Souls Than Last Year





Deflation In 2020-Inflation In 2021—Wow


Urban Alaska CPI-U




In Urban Alaska Inflation Began Accelerating in 2021 And Has Continued Into 2022
